ARE YOU A DIXIE CUP KIND OF A PERSON? By Lisa Whitaker

I know, I know . . what a strange question to ask, right? What you think I am asking is probably not what I am really asking. Let me explain.

While visiting Budapest in March to teach at the Discipleship Training School, I visited with a friend I had not seen in several years. She is the same age as me and we have known each other for over 25 years. She was the first person to greet me and offer hospitality to me when I first came to Budapest back in 1994.

We went for a walk to catch up on how her family is doing, kids getting married and her soon to be empty nest. We were talking about what this season of our life is all about and what difference do we want to make at the end of the day. She made a fascinating comment to me. She said, "I really just want to be a Dixie Cup girl!". I laughed and said, "Ok, so what does THAT mean?" She went on to explain. When people are running races - marathons especially, there are people at water stations along the way. They hand the runner a dixie cup of refreshing H2O. Depending on the runner, that cup of water could be a real deciding factor in the race. No matter what mile marker you are handing out water to the runners, you are helping them get through to the next mile. You may never see that person again, but you helped them get from Point A to Point B and in some cases, you helped them actually be able to finish the race.

We then unpacked that thought a bit more.

There are people in our lives that are around our whole life and then there are others who are in our life for a season. In the middle of the race, when the person is tired, thirsty and in need of some water, what a privilege to be the one to hand them that cup of water and give an encouraging word.

I then began to think about "Dixie Cup" people in the Bible. There are so many of them. People that come on to the scene and help someone get to the next step. Simon from Cyrene, who carried Jesus' cross was a "Dixie Cup" guy. (Luke 23:26) There are a few unknown guys in King David's life that helped him at crucial times - Shobi, Machir and Barzillai. (II Samuel 17:27). Barnabas was a "Dixie Cup" guy for Paul. Barnabas went to Tarsus and got Paul, introduced him to the Jerusalem Church leaders, (Acts 11:23-30) and then went on the first missionary trip with him. (Acts 13:1-4) After that first trip - POOF - we don't read about Barnabas anymore. But where would Paul be if Barnabas had not been around to help him get from Tarsus to Jerusalem to Antioch?

As I have thought about various trips I have taken in the last few years and different people I have interacted with, I can see that God has used me at times to be a "Dixie Cup girl". I want to be available and have my eyes open to those who may need a word of encouragement or a cup of water to get to their next destination. Being a Dixie Cup person isn't going to earn you any trophies, medals or accolades. But then again, God isn't asking us for all of those things. He IS asking us to be faithful to what He has called us to - and in reality, I would venture to say that every one of us at some time or another is called upon to be a "Dixie Cup" person.

Let's have our eyes, ears and hearts open to recognize the opportunities around us to be "Dixie Cup" people. That cup of cold water, at the right time may be exactly what helps someone get to the next place in their life - or maybe even finish their race.

Have a great May and I'm looking forward to being around a bit more in the next few months. I'll still be traveling and teaching, but not gone as long at one time.






