Unknown Heroes . . . By Lisa Whitaker

Tucked away in a mountain camp in Central Asia, a group of 40 Jesus-lovers gathered to learn about leadership, discipleship and what it means to dream God's dream for their people.

I arrived at this primitive yet full of life camp a few weeks ago. By primitive I mean, no heat, no hot water, squatty potties, no showers. By full of life, I mean precious people who love God deeply and have given their lives to follow Him.

I was invited to this camp, where a small team was holding a Leadership Training School for about 40 staff from this Central Asian country. Many of the staff are part of the Discipleship Training Schools we offer in our mission and I was asked come and share about the schools and really just be available to the staff for questions and any input they may need

After arriving, I learned that two of of the local staff had been part of a team that had been arrested for their faith and held captive for 52 days a few years ago. I sat down with this staff to hear their story. The male staff, (I'll call him "H"), is facing many challenges to this day due to the trauma he experienced. The female staff, ("S") told me soon after their were captured and falsely charged, she heard the guards talking to each other about what they should do with the two female members of the team. As they were talking, she prayed and asked the Lord to protect them from any sexual assault. I waited as she continued fearing the worse. She smiled shyly and said, "God heard my cry and we were treated much better than the guys. The guards did not beat us or assault us in any way. It was almost like they were afraid of us." Then her smile faded as she shared, "The guys on the other hand, were tortured and beaten daily".

Also among our group there was a Western leader who was part of the organizing team. He had been arrested in 1985 in Asia with a group and held in prison for 9 days, again falsely accused because of his faith. In his situation, it had become national news back then and the United Nations became involved because the country he was in had gone against the UN human rights act by arresting this small team. Thankfully they were not beaten, but were in a cell for the 9 days waiting to see if anyone knew of their arrest. It was a true miracle how the international community found out about them (ask me in person, as it is too long to share here). It was truly a miracle!

Meeting these precious friends reminded me that there are people all over the world who have suffered greatly for their faith and so many of them are completely unknown to us. They faithfully love and serve our Lord, willing to risk their lives, comfort, material wealth and more so that others may know Jesus personally.

When I think of heroes - these are the people I think of. Heroes of the faith, whose names are worthy of being among the list in Hebrews 11:33,34, "who by faith conquered kingdoms, performed acts of righteousness, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, from weaknesses were made strong, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight".

This group in the mountains of Central Asia were so grateful that we had come to meet with them. They told me this was the first time they had so many international leaders from our mission in one place with them. For them, that was so validating and encouraging. In reality, I am the one so blessed and encouraged by the privilege of meeting them and calling them my brothers and sisters in Christ. Eternity is going to be so much richer with their presence, their exuberant worship, their passionate prayers, their beautiful smiles.

Please take a moment and pray for these friends, especially "H" and "S" as they continue to work through the trauma of being held prisoner. Also, please pray for wisdom for me as I try to connect them with our international family and help to resource them as they dream of beginning schools, projects and ministries that will serve their country and bring the light of God's kingdom into the darkness.

Thank you for being a part in encouraging and loving on these heroes - someday, either here or in eternity, you will get to meet them and you will be blessed!


