

REV. J.W. GREGG MEISTER

The Rev. J.W. Gregg Meister has been the President of Interlink Media LLC since 1988. In addition to his commercial clients, he has videotaped frequently in Cuba, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, and Mexico, producing fundraising and volunteer recruitment videos on behalf of impoverished communities. He has also produced Christian educational videos in Israel and video programming on behalf of the Israeli Defense Forces.

Prior to founding Interlink Media, Rev. Meister served as Pastor of the Lakeside Presbyterian Church in San Francisco from 1975 to 1986. A graduate of Williams College, Gregg earned his M.Div. from Princeton Theological Seminary and has a MA degree in Radio and Television Production from San Francisco State University and a MA degree in communications research from the Annenberg School of Communications at the University of Pennsylvania.

Gregg lives in Merchantville. His wife, Gail, died in 2022 after a brief illness. Their daughter Miriam has a Ph.D. in neuroscience from the University of Texas, Austin, and is currently a researcher for Microsoft in Redmond, Washington.

Gregg has published two books, "The Psalms: The Prayer Book of Jesus," and "Searching For Jesus," both of which are available on Amazon for \$9.95 each under his full name, J.W. Gregg Meister.




