PLEASE READ THE ENTIRE DOCUMENT.

These conditions have been developed to provide for a safe worship experience for you and for others in this pandemic. Remember that these conditions are about loving your neighbor and regarding others as greater than yourself. If you demonstrate a willingness to comply out of love for others, it will help us clear the way for future events and even a return to our building. In the event of inclement weather, it will be canceled, so pray for clear skies and sunshine.

By registering you are agreeing to and understand the following:

- 1.) I will wear a mask the entire time I am at the event from the time I exit my car until I reenter my car. (Especially while speaking to one another, responding softly in the service, and singing softly or humming the hymns)
- 2.) I will social distance 6 ft. from all other family groups.
- 3.) I will do my best to not touch anyone or anything other than my personal belongings.
- 4.) I am responsible to provide and carry my own chair or blanket for sitting.
- 5.) I will follow the directions of those leading the service.
- 6.) The church building will remain closed
- 7.) Restrooms will NOT be available.

Please DO NOT register or attend if you are in an official quarantine, such as because you have been notified of contact with someone who has COVID-19, or you have been exposed to someone who is sick but has not been tested, or you have traveled.

We have done our best to provide a safe environment and have gone to extreme lengths to ensure your continued good health and the good health of your fellow churchgoers.

Please be advised that even with these precautions, there is a risk to attending.
