Back on the Road . . .

This fall has been a busy and very fulfilling one! If you saw my note in September, I was anticipating my fall travels to Romania, Jordan. Albania and South Africa. Let me share a few highlights from each location. It will be a challenge to keep this short, so many good things happened in these last two months.

Romania -

I met with a small group of Discipleship Training School staff. They are mostly from Romania and one from Kosovo. They are all fairly new staff and were so eager to be trained, it was refreshing to come to class every morning and see how excited

they were. I had an interesting response from one staff person. As I was sharing some leadership principles, she slammed her hand on the desk and said, "I am so mad". I was taken aback a bit and said, "what is the matter?" She said, "I am so mad I didn't know all of this earlier!" I had to hold back a smile as she was really frustrated. As I thought about it, I remembered how many times I wished I had known some life principles a few years earlier so I could have avoided some mistakes or misjudgments. Yet, this is how we learn, right? This staff team was a joy to train and reminded me again why I do what I do.

Jordan -

This trip was absolutely revelational for me. I went there with the purpose of leading a pilot seminar on the life of John the Baptist. I had invited a few staff from Europe to come and join me to discover if this seminar would be helpful in the future for a larger group of staff.

I can't even capture here all that I learned as we visited sites where John the Baptist baptized Jesus and also where he was beheaded at Herod's Temple. As we hiked to the top of the mountain where Herod's temple was and we considered John the Baptist's life and his death, so many thoughts flooded my mind and heart. He was truly a humble man, who responded to the call on his life and willingly laid down his life for what he believed. Following the seminar, I have had many other staff ask when I am doing it again. Those that accompanied me shared how much they needed the time we had together to learn, rest and be led through a process as they are usually the ones leading. They loved letting me handle all the details! Again, it was a joy to lead this seminar and I am making plans to offer it again next fall.

Albania -

Just being in Albania was a blessing. This year they celebrated 30 years of openness to the gospel. Believe it or not, it was 30 years ago that this self proclaimed atheist nation opened her borders after the fall of the Berlin Wall. Joining us in our meetings there was a good friend, Al Akimoff who had been one of the first people to preach the gospel in a stadium in Tirana, Albania when it opened. Many of the current pastors today became Christians while attending that gathering in the stadium. It was also a blessing to realize that 30 years ago, while I was doing my initial outreach into Russia, many of my friends that had been in my training school had gone to Albania for outreach. One of my staff members is still serving in Albania. It was a good reminder that our Discipleship Training Schools can have a lasting effect on a nation.

South Africa -

Not only did I travel to South Africa to staff our Master's course on Christian Formation and Discipleship, but I also had the privilege of seeing some friends I had not seen in almost 2 years. Several of these friends have also been co-workers in the mission for over 25 years. It was a blessing to spend time with them and share with them all that has taken place in my life since Mom passed away. Between all of us there have been many deaths of loved ones, new life born and major changes as we have all navigated the COVID scenario. We were all so grateful for time together to learn, laugh, cry, share and just be in person with one another and not on a screen!

I am thankful for the safety and protection that I have had on this trip and am grateful for the prayers and support of all of you. I am so glad to be home for the holidays and will head out again in the New Year on another teaching and training trip. As this year comes to an end, I am so aware of God's care and protection, His provision and attention to details in my life.
